"We are the activists, the artists, the air and the animals; the community builders, the doulas, the herbalists, the earth and the plants; the poets, the storytellers, the makers, the mavericks, the musicians and the music; we are the feelings and the fire, the wonder and the water. We choose possibilities, not parameters. We are the uncivilised.

We, the uncivilised, refuse to participate in a culture based on the desecration of land, life and people. We, the uncivilised, believe in community, collaboration and the inter-connectedness of all life. We, the uncivilised, believe it's time to challenge the stories that imprison us; the stories that uphold the self-destructive system we call Western Civilisation. We, the uncivilised, are claiming the right to write our own story. We are digging up the stories of our soil; we seek stories to inspire, we seek stories to unite, we seek stories to rouse the heart, and activate the soul.

Beyond the boundary, life becomes limitless..."

After reaching their <u>crowd-funding campaign</u> goal filmmakers, Lily and Pete Sequoia are embarking on a pre-release tour and we're delighted to be a part of it

here at Embercombe.

Disillusioned by a cultural story of consumption and alienation, newly married couple, Lily and Pete are called to action. Carrying with them their unborn child, they embark on a year-long journey around the UK, searching for the seeds of an alternative culture and with it hope for the future.

Without any prior filmmaking experience, they borrow the money from a friend to buy a second hand film camera, and set off with an intention to share their experience. Lily and Pete tell us more about the project:

"We have been greatly inspired by the Shodh Yatra, an Indian term, meaning: 'to undertake a journey for the search of knowledge, creativity and innovations at the grassroots'. Information is carried from one village to the next, and shared in order to perpetuate and evolve vital skills.

This summer we will share our experience and learning from one place to the next, connecting folk, and knitting together an uncivilised network across the UK. Fuelled by waste cooking oil, and powered by solar we will screen the film for communities, festivals and transition towns, in locations ranging from urban car parks to village greens."

We follow the filmmakers' quest on this intimate journey as they speak to grassroots activists, alongside the pioneering voices of <u>Satish Kumar</u> (The Ecologist), <u>Polly Higgins</u> (Ecocide Lawyer), <u>Bruce Parry</u> (Explorer), <u>Mark Boyle</u> (Moneyless Manifesto), <u>Martin Shaw</u> (School of Myth), <u>Glennie Kindred</u> (Artist and writer), The late <u>Patrick Whitefield</u> (Permaculturist) and <u>Simon Fairlie</u> (The Land) and our very own founder, <u>Mac Macartney</u>. On this quest, they take with them a question – What could an uncivilised world look like?

'wetheuncivilised, A Life Story', is a grassroots documentary film project that seeks to challenge the 'civilised' story of separation. The film looks at the points in our lives when we have an opportunity to tell a new story, and to step into an 'uncivilised' world of relationship, connection and belonging.

Over the last 6 weeks Embercombe has been hosting a program in collaboration with START (Students Teachers and Refugees Together) in Plymouth to help Refugees and Asylum Seekers to gain basic works skills.

Each week participants have been engaging in a range of tasks including gardening, site and kitchen. The last few weeks have been an exciting chance for participants and the community to meet new people, put down roots in a safe place build friendships and of course, get a lot done.

Participants have been able to develop skills to transfer in to a professional working environment, we have also been able to engage in a skills share, the kitchen has become vibrant with smells of cooking from Pakistan and Kurdistan and one participant lent his accomplished carpentry skills to helping to finish our mushroom growing house. We are looking forward to sampling the delicacies from this in a couple of months!

For everyone involved this time together has been a stimulating time of learning and discovery and we look forward to hosting a new group again in the autumn.

This program has been entirely funded by crowdfunding and in order to run the next instalment we need your help.
